SUNDAY, MAY 21, 2023 – MUSIC SUNDAY AND SPECIAL CHURCH CONFERENCE IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR CHURCH VOTE

Perhaps you've heard the definition of insanity: Doing the same thing over and over again and hoping to get a different result. Moving to a Simplified Accountable Structure (SAS) for the leadership of our church is an opportunity to do something new and different. New for us, that is. This simplified leadership structure has now been utilized in churches of all sizes and has been found to be a blessing and a catalyst for renewed energy and excitement as, as people engage in mission and ministry rather than meetings; and, often, new ministries emerge from people with a passion, a heart for a ministry not yet being engaged at Cedarville.

The idea is to move from meetings to ministry. One saying sums it up: "Meetings produce minutes not ministry." People, and especially younger people, want to DO something, not sit in meetings. A change in our leadership structure would invite everyone in the congregation to choose several ministry opportunities where they wish serve throughout the year. Each year, a booklet would go out to every household with a listing of all ministries, a description of each ministry, and the needed time commitment. Everyone would be encouraged to sign up for a least two ministries in which to be involved throughout the year ahead. Everyone would be asked to make a 1-year commitment (rather than the current 3-year commitment to serve on a committee).

A Special Church Conference has been approved by the District Superintendent for the purpose of voting on a Resolution to change our church structure from Administrative Council and Committees to a Simplified Leadership Structure, which will include a Leadership Board of nine elected members, the pastors, the Lay Leader and the Lay Members to Annual Conference. The Resolution will be sent out for you to review prior to the Special Church Conference vote.

The Leadership Board will meet monthly and will be the one place that people make a three-year commitment to serve. Members will be nominated by our Nominations Committee and will be confirmed (voted in) by a Special Church Conference, where all professing members of the congregation will have a vote regarding the Leadership Board members.

Sunday, May 21, is Music Sunday. We will have one worship service at 10:00 a.m. On your way into worship, all who have taken membership vows and have joined Cedarville UMC will receive a ballot and a copy of the resolution. Immediately following the worship service, we will have a time of prayer, we will vote by completing the ballot (checking your decision). Once all ballots are turned in, everyone is free to leave. The ballots will be counted and the decision will be announced. All are welcome to wait for the results. The results of the vote will also be communicated through a church-wide email, the next week's bulletin, and the next newsletter.

The Timeline/Outline for Sunday, May 21:

All are welcome to leave at this time or remain to hear the results of the vote.

11:08 Count ballots

11:12 - 11:15 Announce results of vote





We have completed two cycles of GriefShare, a grief recovery support group, here at Cedarville Church. On May 3, we will begin our third 13-week seminar.

GriefShare is a weekly video seminar featuring some of the nation's foremost experts on grief recovery topics. Each seminar is combined with a small group discussion time to allow participants to talk about the content of the seminar and about how they are dealing with the death of their loved one. A modest registration fee will include a workbook with short daily questions, insights, Bible verses, and much more which can make a difference for those experiencing loss.

We have had a lot of positive feedback about the sessions we've completed. This new 13-week session will be held beginning Wednesday, May 3 from 6:30pm-8:30pm in room 105, then every Wednesday through July 26.
