As we move into the fall and prepare for the journey ahead, the Nominations Committee is looking for nominations (self or others) of persons to serve on our new Leadership Board as we prepare to implement the Simplified Accountable Structure for our church's governance.

Please take some time to, prayerfully, read over the Leadership Board Covenant (attached). The covenant explains the requirements and commitment for serving on the Leadership Board. Each person elected to serve on the board will sign the covenant as an act of personal commitment.

If you plan to nominate someone to serve on the Leadership Board, please be sure that the person you nominate agrees to the covenant and wishes to serve. Each person who wishes to be considered for service on the Leadership Board should complete the Leadership Board Interest Form (attached) and return it to Pastor Sherry at sherry@cedarvilleumc.org or send to the church office to Pastor Sherry's attention.

Each applicant will meet with the Nominations Committee sometime between October 10-29. During the first week of November, applicants will be notified of the results of the Nominations interviews. Following these notifications, a slate of nominees for the Leadership Board will be sent to the congregation in preparation for a Church Conference vote to be held on November 19.

For those elected to serve on the Leadership Board, training will be held from mid-November into the first week of December in preparation for the Board to begin its ministry on January 1, 2024.

Completed Leadership Board Interest Forms should be returned to Pastor Sherry no later than October 2, 2023.

# 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Schedule


August 6, 2023 – Sunday closest to the formation of Cedarville ME Church from Temple ME Church – Jim Jannotti (Temple UMC) will preach – members of Temple invited to attend. There will be one service at 10:00 in the Sanctuary followed by a Pot luck luncheon in the Family Life Center.

**September 10, 2023** – On September of 1873, the foundation of St. James had been laid in Cedarville, thus establishing the church that is now known as Cedarville United Methodist Church. This is the special day that we celebrate 150 years of ministry! Bishop John Scholl will be bringing the message to us that morning at a 10:00 Worship Service. That evening we will continue the celebration with the **Anniversary Banquet** - catered by Bause Catering with **entertainment by the Coventry Singers!!** Tickets are now on sale at all services.

**October 15, 2023 – Laity Sunday – Rise Against Hunger event**. This is a church-wide mission event that packs food to go to underprivileged countries. The morning will involve stations in the FLC with an assembly line packing the food. No regular service.

November 4, 2023 – Holiday Craft Show and Bazaar, November 19<sup>th</sup> – Thankful Sunday – One service only at 10:00 a.m. in the Sanctuary. This service will give everyone a chance to express what they are thankful about Cedarville as we celebrate our anniversary. We'll be singing the Thanksgiving hymns to raise our voices in thanks! You will also have an opportunity to express your thankfulness by making a donation to Mission First. This service will be in place of the Wednesday Eve Thanksgiving Service. St. James Methodist Episcopal Church – Foundation Laid in September, 1873 (Later renamed Cedarville United Methodist Church)

#### Historical Note – Why we celebrate the 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary in September:

On August 4, 1873, action was taken to establish a Board of Trustees for the mission church in Cedarville under the new Pastor, Rev. Joseph Sleeper. Through this action Temple became the "mother church" of St. James Methodist Episcopal Church. The first Board of Trustees moved quickly to build a suitable sanctuary for the fledgling congregation. George Wanger, one of the first Trustees, offered the board a one-half acre of ground. The ground was given on the provision that the ground be used for a two story building (no one knows why it had to be a two-story building). In **September of 1873**, the foundation of St. James had been laid in Cedarville, and thus establishing the church that is now known as Cedarville United Methodist Church.

#### Safe Sanctuaries Seminar to Review New Policies – September 16, via Zoom

The Eastern PA Conference is offering a training on the new Safe Sanctuaries legislation that was passed at Annual Conference in May. It is an online/Zoom webinar event. All persons who work with children, youth, and vulnerable adults, as well as all staff should plan to attend.

Attend the **EPA Safe Sanctuaries seminar** on Saturday, September 16, 9 a.m. to noon, offered via Zoom. The 3-hour session will cover EPA's new Safe Sanctuaries policies, approved at Annual Conference, and the new Vulnerable Adults policy. Receive .3 CEUs for participation.

"Safe Sanctuaries is vital for all our congregations," says the Rev. Jacqueline Daniszewski, who chairs the EPA Safe Sanctuaries Committee. "This new training event will include updates to our policies. All participants will receive the PowerPoint training slides and other useful information. We have offered the GriefShare program for a full year here at Cedarville Church, hosting 3-13 week sessions. The positive feedback we've received has indicated we have helped many individuals who are grieving a loss. We're ready to start a new session on September 6.

What is GriefShare? It's a weekly video seminar featuring some of the nation's foremost experts on grief recovery topics. Each seminar is combined with a small group discussion time to allow group participants to talk about the content of the seminar and about how they are dealing with the death of their loved one. A modest registration fee will include a workbook with short daily questions, insights, and Bible verses which can make a difference for those experiencing loss.

Our next session will be held every Wednesday evening from September 6 through December 6 from 6:30pm-8:30pm in room 105. Tri-fold brochures are in the narthex and FLC lobby.
