It's been a busy fall here at Mission First! Our events in October were well attended. It was wonderful to see so many of our friends and neighbors come out to support the community! We have received a lot of generous donations to help with winter supplies, but your help is still needed to care for the Mission First family.

We enjoyed hosting our open houses and community wellness event last month. It was wonderful to see



everyone all in one room so that the community can get a clear picture of what resources are available. The Community Wellness event would not have been possible without Joanne Washington's organizational skills.

#### **Community Wellness Event**

Mission First has received many donations from generous friends over the past month. Malva Snyder from the Church of Latter Day Saints sent 200 pounds of clothing and 2 boxes of blankets.

Genesis Housing and Key bank partnered to supply \$1,200 to help buy boots and coats. St. Thomas More provided \$1,000 to help with laundry and supplies. We've received fresh produce weekly from Mt. Caramel and New Hanover Lutheran's gardens. The incredible generosity from our friends and neighbors allows us to help our community. The Mission First family is grateful for all of these donations.
