WHAT IS JESUS UP TO?

"If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me." — Mark 8: 31-38

It seems that we just celebrated Christmas, and yet, in a few weeks we will begin our Lenten journey. The season of Lent begins with Ash Wednesday, which falls on February 14, Valentine's Day.

Using materials from the Worship Design Studio, our Lenten sermon series asks the question: **what r u up 2?**

Lent is often known as a time of giving something up in order to make room in our lives for spiritual pursuits. Rather than just "giving up" in Lent, the scriptures ask us to consider all that Jesus is "up to" and all that he asks us to be up to in his name. Instead of bemoaning what we can't do, or used to do, in a culture where "measuring up" to external standards seems impossible, this Lent we will celebrate the small things that we can do right now to respond to God's call in our place, for our time.

Join us on February 14 at 7:00 p.m. for our Ash Wednesday service where we will receive ashes on our foreheads or hands, a reminder that we are created from the "stuff" of the earth, but also reminded that we are created in the image of our Creating, Redeeming and Sustaining God.



Helpful Suggestions From Financial Counting Teams

Thank you to all for your contributions. Your faithful financial stewardship is greatly appreciated. We would like to make a few suggestions that would really assist us to ensure your contributions are credited to your preferred funds and missions when counting the offerings received each Sunday.:

- 1) If you have Giving Envelopes, please indicate the amount on the line provided. The counting team members must write this in if left blank since the data input to the computer is done from the envelopes.*
- 2) If you want the amount you are giving to be applied to different funds, i.e. Mission First, Mitten Tree, Blankets, UMCOR, etc, please indicate this on your envelope. Envelopes with no specific fund listed will be credited to our very important Current fund for all our Church needs.
- 3) If you are **not** an e-giver and do not have an Envelope Set but would like one, please contact Susan and a set will be provided to you.
- 4) If you write a check for the plate and want it applied to multiple funds, please take advantage of a Visitor envelope from the pew to direct your contribution as you wish, *
- 5) If you miss a week, or a month, etc., you do not need to provide us with the envelopes for the times you have missed. You may provide one envelope for the total amount missed.
- 6) Please make all checks payable to Cedarville United Methodist Church. Please indicate on your envelope what funds you wish your contribution be applied, and they will be credited to that fund. Checks made payable to Mission First complicates the counting process, and can delay the deposit credit.

*We do preserve the envelopes for audit purposes, we do not hold checks or copies of the checks. Again, thank you for your continued financial gifts to Cedarville's ongoing ministries.

We don't know what this winter will bring, but we do know our neighbors will need help with warm housing and food. In order to serve this uncertainty, we have established a Dedicated Fund called the




Mission First Emergency Relief Fund administered by our MF Director and the MF Operating Committee.


Cedarville Leadership Board

Emilie Atkinson:



All New GriefShare Set to Begin in March

We have offered the GriefShare program for more than a year here at Cedarville Church, hosting four 13week sessions. The positive feedback we've received has indicated we have helped many individuals who are grieving a loss.

We're ready to start a new session on March 6. And we're set to use brand new GriefShare materials as we roll out the fourth edition.

What is GriefShare? It's a weekly video seminar featuring some of the nation's foremost experts on grief recovery topics. Each seminar is combined with a small group discussion time to allow group participants to talk about the content of the seminar and about how they are dealing with the death of their loved one. A modest registration fee will include a participants guide with short daily questions, insights, and Bible verses which can make a difference for those experiencing loss.

Our next session will be held every Wednesday evening from March 6 through May 29 from 6:30 p.m.-8:30 p.m. in room 105.
